Newspaper Advertising:

First advertisement should appear the week-end prior to the commencement of the drive - i.e. May 17th. Suggested size of this insertion - 600 lines (4 cols. x 10g ins.). Larger 1000 line (5 cols. x 14g ins.) advertisement should be scheduled to appear on the opening day of the drive - May 19th. Follow-up insertions should appear during the first week when it is important that greatest pressure should be put on. Suggested dates - Wednesday, May 21st, and Friday, May 23rd. Preferably the May 21st insertion should be of 1000 lines in size, while the May 24th (i.e. preceeding May 24th holiday) could be 600 lines. Insertions through the subsequent weeks of the campaign should be left flexible - and adjusted to meet changing conditions.

The total lineage ellotted to newspapers totals 5,000 - 3,200 of which will have been run by the end of the first week of the drive.

Radio Advertising:

This, of necessity, is something which must be left open until time availabilities from the various stations are received. However there is every reason to hope that the stations will be prepared to donate free time very generously. The amount of \$1,000,00 allocated for this medium is obviously an arbitrary figure - but at all events it will not be exceeded. Stations to be used will be - CJOR, CRNX, CRMO and possibly CRNW.

Printing:

The figure of \$1,500.00 is again an arbitrary one - and it is to be hoped that all of this amount will not be spent.

It will cover cost of production of approximately 35 - 50,000 folders - and other small miscellaneous jobs - such as "Charter-Member" Certificates etc. - if used.

Publicity:

The amount of \$300.00 allocated under this item will cover any incidental publicity items - such as photographs, cuts for use in department store advertisements etc. etc.
